A firm that claims compliance with the GIPS standards must establish policies and procedures for complying with all the applicable requirements of the GIPS standards. Verification provides assurance on whether the firm's policies and procedures related to composite and pooled fund maintenance, as well as the calculation, presentation, and distribution of performance, have been designed in compliance with the GIPS standards and have been implemented on a firm-wide basis. The Trivalent International Small-Capitalization Equity Composite has had a performance examination for the periods January 1, 2014, through December 31, 2022. - Victory Capital Management Inc. (VCM) is a diversified global investment adviser registered under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 and comprises multiple investment franchises: Integrity Asset Management, Munder Capital Management, New Energy Capital Partners, NewBridge Asset Management, RS Investments, Sophus Capital, Sycamore Capital, THB Asset Management, Trivalent Investments, Victory Income Investors (formerly USAA Investments, a Victory Capital Investment Franchise), and the VictoryShares & Solutions Platform. Munder Capital Management and Integrity Asset Management became part of the VCM GIPS firm effective November 1, 2014; RS Investments and Sophus Capital effective January 1, 2017; Victory Income Investors, effective July 1, 2019; THB Asset Management, effective March 1, 2021, and New Energy Capital effective November 1, 2021. Effective September 1, 2023, INCORE Capital Management is no longer part of the VCM GIPS firm.
- 3. The Trivalent International Small-Capitalization Equity Composite includes all fee-paying, non-wrap discretionary portfolios of \$100,000 or more that are managed according to the Trivalent International Small-Capitalization Equity strategy. The strategy focuses on foreign small-cap companies that are characterized by improving business momentum and attractive valuations. Prior to October 2012, the minimum size for inclusion in the composite was \$1 million. The composite has a policy to temporarily remove accounts from the composite when a significant cash flow occurs. Effective December 2015, a significant cash flow is defined as a cash inflow or outflow of 15% or more of the portfolio value at the beginning of the month. The account is removed from the composite for the month in which that cash flow occurred. The composite creation date is September 2007, and the composite inception date is September 2007.
- 4. The benchmark of the composite is the S&P[®] Developed ex-U.S. SmallCap Index (Net). The S&P[®] Developed ex-U.S. SmallCap Index (Net) consists of the stocks representing the lowest 15% of float-adjusted market capitalization in each country other than the U.S. represented in the S&P[®] Developed Broad Market Index (BMI). The S&P[®] Developed BMI includes all listed shares of companies from 24 developed countries with float-adjusted market capitalizations of at least US\$100 million and annual trading value of at least US\$50 million. The benchmark returns are provided to represent the investment environment existing during the time periods shown and are not covered by the report of independent verifiers. For comparison purposes, the index is fully invested, which includes the reinvestment of income. The returns have been taken from a published source and do not include any transaction fees, management fees, or other costs.
- 5. The internal dispersion of annual returns is measured by the standard deviation of asset-weighted gross returns of accounts included in the composite for the full year. If less than six portfolios are included in the composite for the full year, no dispersion measure is presented, as it is not considered meaningful (N/M). The three-year annualized ex-post standard deviation measures the variability of the composite's gross returns, and the benchmark returns over the preceding 36-month period. It is not required to be presented for annual periods prior to 2011 or when a full three years of composite performance is not yet available.

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6. Composite and benchmark returns are presented net of non-reclaimable withholding taxes. Gross-of-fees returns are presented before management and custodial fees but after all trading expenses. Net-of-fees returns are calculated by deducting 1/12 of the highest tier of the standard fee schedule in effect for the period noted (the model fee). The composite model fee for each period is either the highest tier of the current fee schedule or a higher value, whichever is required to ensure the model composite net-of-fee return is lower than or equal to the composite net-of-fee return calculated using actual fees. Actual fees may vary depending on, among other things, the applicable fee schedule and portfolio size. Prior to November 2014, net returns for this composite were calculated using actual management fees. The composite includes a limited distribution pooled fund (Victory Trivalent International Small Cap Collective Fund). The highest management fee schedule and expense ratio for the pooled fund is 0.85%. The firm's fees are available on request and may be found on Part 2A of its Form ADV.
